f your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother. <sup>16</sup>But if he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, that every charge may be established by the evidence of two or three witnesses. <sup>17</sup>If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church. And if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. <sup>18</sup>Truly, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. <sup>19</sup>Again I say to you, if two of you agree on earth about anything they ask, it will be done for them by my Father in heaven. <sup>20</sup>For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them."

## Creedal Response: Westminster Larger Catechism

Q 143. What is the ninth commandment?

- A. The ninth commandment is, "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor."
- Q 144. What are the duties required in the ninth commandment?
- A. The duties required in the ninth commandment are the following:
  - preserving and promoting truth between one person and another;
  - upholding the good name of our neighbor as much as our own:
  - appearing and standing for the truth, from the heart, sincerely, freely, clearly, and fully;
  - speaking the truth, and only the truth, in matters of judgment and justice and in all other things;
  - a charitable esteem of our neighbors, loving, desiring, and rejoicing in their good name and sorrowing for and covering their infirmities, freely acknowledging their gifts and graces, defending their innocence, readily receiving a good report, and unwillingly admitting an evil report concerning them.

### Additional Scripture

Exodus 2:23-25 / During those many days the king of Egypt died, and the people of Israel groaned because of their slavery and cried out for help. Their cry for rescue from slavery came up to God. And God heard their groaning, and God remembered his covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob. God saw the people of Israel—and God knew.
