Sermon: Hebrews 1:1-4 & Hebrews 4:14-16 "Christ Our Mediator Part 2: Truly God, Truly Human"

Hebrews 1:1-4

Loong ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, ²but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world. ³He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, ⁴having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

Hebrews 4:14-16

Since then we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. ¹⁵For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. ¹⁶Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

Additional Scripture

Hebrews 5:1-3 / For every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He can deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is beset with weakness. Because of this he is obligated to offer sacrifice for his own sins just as he does for those of the people.

Hebrews 5:7-10 / In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to him who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverence. Although he was a son, he learned obedience through what he suffered. And being made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey him, being designated by God a high priest after the order of Melchizedek.

Creedal Response: Westminster Shorter Catechism

Q 38. Why was it necessary that the mediator should be God?

A. It was necessary that the mediator should be God

- so that he might sustain and keep the human nature from sinking under the infinite wrath of God and the power of death;
- so that he might give worth and effectiveness to his sufferings, obedience, and intercession;
- and so that he might satisfy God's justice, procure his favor, purchase a special people, give his Spirit to them, conquer all their enemies, and bring them to everlasting salvation.

Q 39. Why was it necessary that the mediator should be a man?

A. It was necessary that the mediator should be man

- so that he might represent our nature, performing obedience to the law and suffering and making intercession for us in our nature;
- so that he might have a fellow-feeling of our infirmities;
- and so that we might receive the adoption of sons and have comfort and access with boldness to the throne of grace.
